The discipline "Principles of Choreographic Composition" - Part 1" is fundamental. It examines the main components of choreographic composition - ways of building different types of dance. Building through exposition, development, climax, reprise. Similar structural units in dance and music are sought. As well as fundamental differences between their structure and ways of impact. The material is divided into four parts:

- Part One Composition of a Thematic Dance
- Second part Story dance composition

- Mastering the basic components of choreographic art exposition, plot, development of the action, climax, denouement.
- Discovering similar (or different) techniques to those in dramatic theater and music

ANNOTATION

Students study the principles and rules of form formation in Bulgarian dance folklore. In the process of training, students develop their improvisational abilities by creating variations and new developments on various dance themes, striving after the author's intervention and change, to preserve the characteristic stylistic features of the folklore patterns.

The lecture course on "Bulgarian Folk Dances - Processing and Forming" includes the study of the principles of form formation, ornamentation and variation of dance movements.

In the exercises during the training process, students develop their improvisational abilities by creating variations and new developments on various dance themes.

ANNOTATION

The course introduces students to the system of classical dance, emphasizing its basic movements and teaching methods for beginners. The training combines theory and practice, providing an opportunity to build technical skills, understanding of style, and creative interpretation.

The lecture course examines the principles of performing basic exercises, typical difficulties in their mastery, as well as approaches to correcting errors. Special attention is paid to the logic of the teaching sequence and to the methods of adapting the material to different age and preparation levels.

The practical classes focus on three main components: exercises on the machine, movements in the environment and jumps. Students not only perform the technique, but also practice building short compositions based on the classical language. The program is structured in seven methodological levels – from basic exercises to compositional solutions for advanced performers.

The academic discipline aims to:

- To develop skills in analyzing movement and presenting the material in an accessible manner.
- To encourage creative thinking through the creation of original sketches.

The discipline is aimed at expanding the knowledge and practical skills of students in the field of characteristic dance - stage-processed dance styles inspired by the traditions of different peoples and cultures. The training combines work with the characteristic plasticity, rhythm, dynamics and styles, in order to create choreographic compositions that preserve the spirit of a given nationality, but recreate it in a stage and stylized form. The focus is on the processing and formation of dance combinations inspired by Russian, Spanish, Hungarian, Italian, Polish, **Georgian** and other nationalities. During the training, students become familiar with the characteristic movements, poses, jumps, accents and musical features inherent to each style. The exercises include technical improvement, improvisational tasks and the creation of short forms. Within the framework of practical classes, students become familiar with basic typical dances and with characteristic lexical movements suitable for creating original choreography. Stylistic features characteristic of different national traditions are examined, as well as principles for their stage interpretation and compositional development. Special emphasis is placed on the relationship between musical and choreographic material. Students work on tasks related to the construction of a dance composition through the development of a drawing, angles and stage behavior, with the inclusion of gesture, mimicry and pantomime as means of expression.

The academic discipline aims to

- To build choreographic staging skills in students;
- Independently and methodically build educational dance and concert forms, correctly compose them with clear criteria for methodicality and national stylistics.
- To master the principles of dramaturgy in thematic dances.
- To master the peculiarities of plotless divertissement dances.
- To introduce students to the basic principles for constructing characteristic dance in various forms solo, duet, trio, quartet, ensemble;
- Principle of constructing the dance according to the level of knowledge and practical skills of the performers;
- To master the methodological principles of dance movements in composition;
- To master the use of dance elements from different nationalities in different forms;
- To prepare students for independent and professional development of dance combinations and dance compositions;

ANNOTATION

The course aims to introduce students to the specificity, place and role of dance in classical and contemporary musical and stage genres, with an emphasis on opera, operetta and musical.

The first module examines the traditional functions of dance scenes in opera and operetta.

The second module is dedicated to the musical genre – its specificity, development and its influence on contemporary musical theatre. The emphasis is on its synthetic nature, in which dance, singing and acting exist in equal cooperation. The dance material in the musical often carries both stylistic-informative and plot-dramaturgical value. Students will get acquainted with leading choreographers and emblematic choreographic solutions in musicals such as "The Addams Family", "Chicago", "Cats", "The Phantom of the Opera", "Aladdin", as well as Bulgarian examples.

The course encourages students to analyze and create choreographic solutions that are consistent with the dramaturgical idea, musical style, and stage realization.

The academic discipline aims to:

To introduce students to the characteristics and role of dance in classical musical and stage genres - opera and operetta, musical and to guide them towards recognizing the stylistics and functions of choreography in them. To present contemporary trends in choreography and direction of these genres, both in a national and international context.

Abstract:

The course CHOREOGRAPHIC DIRECTION (MODERN) CHOREOGRAPHY) is aimed at revealing the basic methodological and theoretical laws and principles of choreographic direction and their practical application in story-based works.

In the first part on the training is provoke the students yes put a choreographic work based on a literary source - a fable, a story, a novel.

In the second part of the training students are provoked to choreograph a work of your choice.

Contents on the school discipline:

In **the lecture course**, students learn to write the libretto for a literary work. In the **exercises**, their ideas are practically realized in choreographic movements.

The lecture course covers topics that address - emergence of the plot idea and its shaping in the "libret" - as a literary exposition; analysis of the libretto; theme and idea, arrangement of images and actors; choreographic dramaturgical construction; choreographer's **directorial** plan, etc.

"Choreographic Direction" as an academic discipline and creative specialty of professional direction "Musically and dance art" there is for his/her own main The goal is to train and educate students as creative professionals in the field of choreographic direction and to optimally develop their creative abilities.

The course is aimed at introducing students to the forms and structures of Bulgarian dance folklore and developing improvisational abilities by creating variations from different ethnographic areas;

Technology on the training and evaluation:

The lecture hall course by "INTERPRETATION" ON TRADITIONAL "RITUALITY" includes - the study of the Dramaturgy of ritual action, the interpretation of ritual actions through choreographic solutions, etc.

In the exercises during the learning process, students develop their improvisational skills. their abilities by creating variations and new developments on various dance themes from traditional rituals

The exam consists of a written essay and practical implementation - creating a choreographic text for interpretation of the ritual action, compositional solutions and choreographic text for the symbols in the ritual, stage interpretation of a traditional ritual.
