QUALIFICATION CHARACTERISTICS

I. GENERAL DESCRIPTION OF THE DOCTORAL PROGRAMME

The dynamic changes occurring across all spheres of public life created a clear need for specialists who understand the political system and processes, as well as their growing influence on the broader social structure. The PhD programme in *Political Science* responds to this demand by preparing highly qualified experts capable of actively engaging in various areas of public life. Graduates are expected to demonstrate professionalism, creativity, and a strong sense of civic responsibility, applying their knowledge, skills, and competencies to the analysis and forecasting of political processes.

The PhD programme in *Political Science* is accredited in three modes of study: full-time, part-time, and individual, and is offered in both Bulgarian and English. The programme's academic documentation is aligned with the core principles of modern higher education.

In the course of doctoral training, the Department of Philosophical and Political Sciences provides opportunities for:

- the application of contemporary teaching methods;
- the acquisition of knowledge and skills for research activity;
- effective scholarly communication between faculty and doctoral students;
- the development of teamwork and collaboration skills;
- adherence to established academic and ethical values;
- participation in research projects and scientific research;
- active involvement in academic forums and conferences;
- involvement in the Department's affairs and the broader professional political science network.

Doctoral education is carried out based on an *Individual Study Plan*, developed for each PhD student. This plan outlines the responsibilities of both the doctoral candidate and the university, including mandatory examinations, the key components of the dissertation, teaching duties, and administrative activities. Each PhD student's curriculum also includes foreign language training, which is delivered through self-study as well as participation in courses and workshops. The Individual Study Plans are jointly prepared by the doctoral students and their academic supervisors, reviewed by the Department of Philosophical and Political Sciences, and formally approved by the Faculty Council of the Faculty of Philosophy.

II. OBJECTIVES OF THE DOCTORAL PROGRAMME

The PhD programme in *Political Science* aims to prepare specialists with the professional qualifications necessary to carry out analytical, research, teaching, expert,

administrative, and other specialized activities related to both the theory and practice of politics and political science.

III. GENERAL QUALIFICATION AND SPECIALIZATION OF THE DOCTORAL PROGRAMME

The doctoral programme emphasizes deep disciplinary knowledge and the development of skills for independent, critical application of that knowledge. Students are trained to conduct professional analyses, draw comparisons, and provide expert assessments and recommendations in key political decision-making processes. Special attention is also given to cultivating advanced language proficiency and communication skills, reflecting both the regional context of SWU "Neofit Rilski" and Bulgaria's evolving role within the globalized European Union.

IV. KNOWLEDGE, SKILLS AND COMPETENCES ACQUIRED, IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE NATIONAL QUALIFICATIONS FRAMEWORK

- Have a solid understanding of the international relations system and global political processes.

- Analyze public opinion, attitudes, and the behavior of social groups and individuals;

- Analyze problematic situations with insight, propose informed solutions, and formulate realistic forecasts;

- Deliver comprehensive evaluations and recommendations to support decision-making processes related to societal development at international, national, and regional levels.

- Proficiency in foreign languages and and adaptability to diverse learning methods.

- Organize and lead academic forums or workshops to debate specific issues;
- **Develop** theoretical models, methodologies, and instruments for investigating emerging or long-standing social and institutional challenges;
- Capable of participating in the organization and conduct of research on various aspects of social reality
- Interpret research findings and articulate their social and policy implications.

V. AREAS OF PROFESSIONAL REALIZATION

The educational and scientific degree of *Doctor* in the *Political Science* doctoral programme (professional field 3.3 Political Sciences) offers opportunities for successful professional realization across a wide range of public sectors, including politics, academia, education, media and communications, governance, and business. PhD holders in Political Science may pursue careers in international institutions and organizations, non-governmental organizations, local self-government and administrative bodies, as well as national government institutions.

Annotation:

The main goal of the course is to present the most important directions of development of the political life. Having completed the course, the doctoral students shall be able to recognize and analyze trends in the development of the political life, both from a social and managerial point of view, as well as from an ideological perspective.

Content of the course:

The course comprises analyses of the following: trends in the development of the party system and electoral systems; political ideologies; trends in the development of political regimes; the relationship between globalization and the nation-state; the main international political entities; social policy and the degradation of the "welfare state"; leadership in contemporary environment and circumstances; new technologies and their impact on political life; trends in the development of the civil society.

Teaching and assessment method:

The training is carried out by means of traditional and contemporary interactive teaching methods and approaches. The final grade is formed on the basis of a written exam covering the study material and the syllabus. The final grade is formed in compliance with the ECTS requirements.

PROJECT PREPARATION AND PROJECT MANAGEMENT

ECTS credits: 3 Hours: 30 lectures + 60 seminars

Annotation:

This course presents the main parameters and methodology of project planning and development, and the implementation of project activities. Emphasis is also placed on the various aspects and mechanisms of application, structure of the project proposal and project management from the time of submission of documents to the implementation of the project activities, the types of entities eligible to apply, as well as the application method for the various funds and programs.

Content of the course:

The specifics of the project activity are presented, according to the chronological stages of the emergence of the project idea, the preparation of a project proposal, the specific components necessary for the realization of the project, subjects and objects in this process. The doctoral students shall become familiar with the technology of the creation and management of project as well as of its implementation and expected results.

Teaching and assessment method:

The training is carried out by means of traditional and contemporary interactive teaching methods and approaches. The final grade is formed on the basis of a written exam. The final grade is formed in compliance with the ECTS requirements.

ENGLISH LANGUAGE
